In the last two years alone, multiple firefighting agencies came together in an emergency effort to battle the monstrous blazes of the Holy Jim and Canyon 2 Fire. Holy Jim scorched over 23,000 acres. The Canyon 2 Fire charred over 9,000 acres, saw over 16,000 residents evacuated, and caused millions of dollars in damages.

We learned the homes that were spared had followed proactive safety measures, including brush clearing and the installation of fire-resistant roofs. This demonstrates that preventative fire safety measures work.

I'm collaborating with the Board and the Orange County Fire Authority to enhance fire protection resources and create the most impactful plans to protect you.



The Canyon communities will see a concerted effort focused on advance planning of brush-clearing projects, orderly evacuation plans, school closure announcements, and effective emergency messaging on our roads.

Part of my advocacy will include the convening of town hall meetings to discuss emergency communications and preventative solutions.

To uphold the safety of our fantastic but fire-prone communities, I implore you to become involved in our protective efforts. Follow my District newsletter to stay updated on this hot issue.
